Summary of Teaching Evaluations at Oklahoma State University

Below I have included selected questions and responses from my teaching evaluations from courses that I have taught while an Assistant Professor Oklahoma State University. These courses represent a broad swath of students; I have taught introductory through advanced undergraduate courses at OSU's campuses in both Stillwater and Tulsa. Moreover, I have also been heavily involved in graduate education, not only for our Political Science M.A. program but also our M.A./PhD program in Fire and Emergency Management.

At the end of each semester, students evaluated their courses using a standard battery of questions arranged on an ordinal scales. This assessment procedure has changed twice since Spring 2015. For courses starting in Fall 2015 we used Scantron's Class Climate system. These evaluations differ in substance from the previous forms and, unlike our past evaluations, are delivered online to students. These evaluations require that at least three students complete them in order for a report to be generated. This explains why there is no evaluation available for two of my courses, an Honors Section of American Government taught in Fall 2015 and our Graduate Seminar in International Relations in Spring 2016. Since Fall 2016, I have used an in-class survey designed by our department. These largely mirror the previous teaching evaluations, but uses a different scoring system.
